Creative

Make various colours with paint and water. Put each colour in a section in the ice cube tray. I like placing a popsicle stick in each one. Allow the coloured water to freeze. Once it is frozen allow the children to paint on a piece of paper with them.

Indoor Sensory Play

Bring the snow indoors and put it into a large bowl or container. Add various items for the children to use such as spoons, small containers, cookie cutters and anything else you can think of.
